

PROJECT EMBRACE

New and Expanded Service for Patients with Substance Use Disorders

Project Embrace is a maternal wraparound program offering recovery support and care coordination for pregnant women who struggle with substance use and addiction. Managed by the Southern New Jersey Perinatal Cooperative, Project Embrace services are free, voluntary and available throughout South Jersey.

PROGRAM ESSENTIALS

- Case manager develops a single, coordinated care plan for each participant's recovery.
- Case manager acts as a liaison to prenatal providers, treatment providers, hospitals and all other agencies involved with participant's care.
- Program priority is for each participant to maintain continuous care by an obstetrician throughout pregnancy and to remain in substance use treatment.
- Each participant is matched with a Recovery Specialist who provides support and assistance to navigate treatment, social services and recovery support systems.
- At least two home visits are conducted monthly; telephone support is available, as needed.

WHO'S ELIGIBLE

- Must be pregnant at time of referral
- Must live in Atlantic, Burlington, Camden, Cape May, Cumberland, Gloucester or Salem County
- Must have a substance use disorder
